INSTRUCTIONS PRIOR TO ANESTHESIA (IV Sedation/IV General Anesthesia)

IV Sedation or General Anesthesia is a serious procedure. Certain steps must be followed before and after your procedure to ensure your safety and comfort. Please read and follow the instructions carefully.

- **A licensed driver MUST accompany the patient to the office, and the driver must remain in the office the entire time during the procedure, and be available to drive the patient home. The patient may not drive a vehicle or operate any machinery for 24 hours following the anesthesia experience.**
- **Do not have anything to eat or drink after midnight or eight (8) hours prior to the appointment.**
- **CLEAR LIQUIDS (small amount of water) can be taken up to two hours prior to the appointment.**
- Generally, all routine oral medications (such as blood pressure medications, etc) should be taken prior to surgery at their regularly scheduled times but only with a **small sip of water**. Please check with the doctor prior to the surgical date for specific instructions regarding routine medications.
- Diabetic patients should bring their glucometer and insulin/medications with them to the appointment. The doctor will give additional instructions regarding diet, and how to take the diabetes medications/insulin.
- Patients with Asthma/COPD who use rescue inhalers (such as Albuterol) should remember to bring their inhaler with them to the appointment.
- Do not smoke for at least 12 hours before surgery. Ideally, cut down or stop smoking as soon as possible prior to the day of surgery. Refrain from drinking alcohol for the 48 hours prior to your procedure.
- Please wear comfortable clothing with loose-fitting sleeves, which can be rolled up past the elbow, and flat shoes or sneakers.
- Contact lenses, and jewelry should be removed before surgery. Dentures may be removed at the time of surgery.
- Do not wear lipstick, excessive makeup, or nail polish on the day of surgery.
- If you have an illness such as a cold, fever, sore throat, respiratory infection, upset stomach or upset bowel, or other significant medical condition please notify the office prior to your procedure.
- Please remember to pick up any prescriptions given at the consultation appointment PRIOR to the treatment appointment.
